

1st paragraph is about Egyptian Death Rituals

In Ancient Egypt, burying a dead body (in this case, a Pharaoh) was a long process. First, the brain would be pulled out of the nose using a hook, they would make a cut on the left side of the body, and all the internal organs would be removed. Then the internal organs dried. The lungs, intestines, stomach, and liver would go in canopic jars. The heart, however, was put back inside the body. After that the inside of the body was rinsed with spices and wine, covered with salt for seventy days, and after forty days the corpse was stuffed with linen or sand so it would have more of a human shape. Finally, after the seventy days the body was wrapped from head to toe in bandages and put inside a sarcophagus. The tomb was the pyramid, and inside was quite like a home, with all the things he/she would need in the afterlife.

Khufu ruled from about 2589 B.C. to 2566 B.C. When he ruled, it was during the old kingdom and he was the second pharaoh of the fourth dynasty of Kings. Khufu had fifteen daughters and nine sons, which isn't even that many compared to other pharaohs. Some say that Khufu was cruel, especially to the slaves who built The Great Pyramid of Giza. In fact, he once let a criminal die so a magician could try resurrecting whoever the criminal was. The criminal did not, however, come back to life. But Khufu was most famous for The Great Pyramid of Giza, which is still one of the seven wonders of the world.

Khufu did have a reputation for forcing slaves to build The Great Pyramid of Giza.
