6.	How does Melinda communicate with her parents? Give at least two examples. What is her overall opinion of her parents?
7.	Explain what the narrator feels is <i>ironic</i> about the cheerleaders at her school.
8.	How does Nicole fit into Melinda's life? (Look at the description of gym class.)

9.	What assignment does Mr. Freeman give his students? At first, Melinda thinks this assignment is too easy. How does it change over time?
